WHAT WE ARE UP AGAINST

Worldwide, more than 36,000 people die preventable deaths each day.

Every minute of every day:

- 2 children die of malaria
- 4 children die of diarrhea and other diseases borne by dirty water
- 15 people die as a result of hunger and malnutrition
- 6 people die of HIV/AIDS
- 4 people die of tuberculosis



More than 48 million people—greater than the entire population of Spain—are infected or affected by HIV/AIDS, including:

- 33 million people infected with HIV
- 15 million children orphaned by AIDS

And in the countries where we work:

- In Haiti, 54% of the population lives on less than \$1 per day, barely enough to buy two cups of rice following the recent spike in food prices.
- In Rwanda, malnutrition affects nearly a quarter of all children and is the cause of more than 40% of deaths of children under five.
- In Lesotho, life expectancy at birth is only 35 years, mostly due to the fact that nearly one quarter of all adults are infected with HIV.
- In Malawi, 1 out of every 7 women will die as a result of complications of pregnancy or childbirth.

WHAT WE HAVE ACHIEVED

Working with local partner organizations, we are the main provider of health care for more than 2 million people in 10 countries.

We have built or renovated, and currently operate:

- 8 hospitals
- 19 health centers

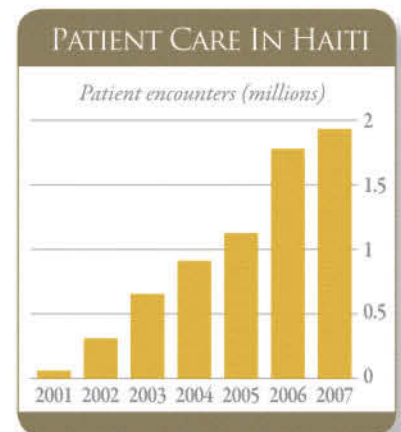
We employ more than 6,000 people around the world, of whom more than 5,900 come from the countries and communities where we work. PIH's global staff includes:

- 139 doctors and 32 dentists
- 338 nurses and 304 nursing assistants
- 3,350 *accompagnateurs* (community health workers)



In Haiti during 2007, our partners at Zanmi Lasante

- Recorded more than 1.9 million patient encounters (see graph)
- Distributed 454 metric tons of food
- Provided antiretroviral treatment (ART) for 3,562 HIV patients
- Delivered an average of 419 babies and conducted more than 750 family planning visits every month



Our other partners also reported impressive gains in combating disease and poverty, including:

- In Rwanda, more than 3,000 HIV patients received ART
- In Peru, 22 micro-enterprises were launched to provide employment and income for MDR-TB patients
- In Lesotho, 3,485 households received food supplements
- In Malawi, homes were built or renovated for 51 families
